BOARD DIRECTOR REPORT

DAVID LENEHAN | BOARD CHAIR

The BSHS Board of Directors held its monthly meeting on Wednesday 26 July 2023. The first item on the agenda was the election of Office Bearers for the 2023–2024 financial year. I will continue in the role of Board Chair until the end of December when Dr. Marg Way will take on the Board Chair role. Unfortunately, Marg will be on leave of absence from the Board for the next six months as she is currently employed by Safer Care Victoria on a limited term project. Due to Health Department rules she is ineligible to sit on the Board while engaged in this role.

Nigel Jarvis has been elected as Board Deputy Chair and all Directors have accepted roles on the various Board Sub Committees that make up the BSHS Governance structure. I would like to thank the Directors for their support and contribution to the governance of the Health Service over the past 12 months and look forward to their continued commitment during the 2023–2024 financial year. The Board noted advice from Safer Care Victoria that a redeveloped Clinical Governance Induction Program will be launched in the coming months. The program will enable Boards, CEOs and Health Service Executives to support the delivery of safe, effective and person centered care. Training sessions will be available online from August to November and all Directors and Executive staff are encouraged to register for this training in the critical role of clinical governance.

The Health Department has announced the development of a "Hospital System Plan". The plan will define how Victoria's public hospital system should be structured to deliver the health programs and outcomes that matter for local communities. The plan will be developed in collaboration with CEO's and Board Chairs and will be completed by April 2024, for consideration by the Department. The Board will be watching this with interest.

Director of Clinical Services, Mary Cushing, advised that BSHS had been selected as a finalist in the awards for Small Employer of the Year and Apprenticeships and Training Development. Well done to Learning and Development Manager, Kim Stevens, in preparing the application for submission to the Victorian Training Awards.

From the Support Services we heard of the work that has gone into researching the most appropriate food delivery equipment to ensure improved food preparation and delivery to our Delama residents. As a consequence the recommended food transport container and trolley have now been ordered and will be available in the near future. Our thanks to all involved in identifying and procuring the most appropriate equipment for this service. Also the kitchens at Beaufort and Skipton have recently completed their annual Food Safety Audits and were found to be fully compliant with all health and food safety standards and regulations. Our congratulations to the Kitchen Managers and staff on achieving this excellent result.

At this stage I should mention the commitment of Chris Nykoluk who joined the meeting on Zoom while on holidays in Darwin and also Director Jo Hall, who Zoomed in from her bed while unwell. Your contribution to the meeting was much appreciated. Finally on behalf of the Board, can I thank Management and staff for their commitment and contribution for what has been a successful twelve months for the Health Service.

REDUCING OUR FOOTPRINT

Procurement Officer, Sheryl Darken, has been working hard to find environmentally sustainable options for many of our products for our Health Service, whilst not increasing our expenditure. Sheryl has sourced the eco pen that is made from 71% post-consumer recycled material. These pens are purchased from a 100% owned First Nations organisation, that supports First Nation's mental health, entrepreneurship and education, as well as employment opportunities for young First Nations Australians. The highlighters that are now being purchased are an eco friendly choice, made from 85% recycled materials. Our bin liners and examination gloves are now also biodegradable. Medicine and pill cups are now paper instead of single use plastic. Our Meals on Wheels containers are now also compostable. After the single use ban of plastic cutlery in Victoria, we have moved to Enviro teaspoons. Thank you to Sheryl for all her hard work.

DECREASE IN ACCEPTANCE OF CONTROLLING BEHAVIOURS

Changes in community attitudes and knowledge of gender equality indicate an increasing understanding of the seriousness of controlling behaviours such as financial abuse. Data indicates that recognition of pervasive non-physical forms of violence – such as financial abuse, social control, emotional abuse, and bullying – has grown over time. Data also suggests that Victorian women are more likely than men to recognise the seriousness of male-perpetrated financial abuse. Recognition of the gravity and extent of controlling behaviour such as financial abuse is an essential precursor to challenging the norms which underlie violence against women and family violence.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH Creamy Mushroom Pasta

INGREDIENTS

300g penne pasta 1 tbs extra virgin olive oil 1 medium brown onion, thinly sliced 2 cloves garlic, crushed 400g mushrooms, thinly sliced 120g baby spinach leaves 1 cup smooth light ricotta 80g parmesan, finely grated 1/2 bunch continental parsley, chopped



METHOD

 Cook pasta in a large saucepan of boiling water according to packet instructions.
 Drain, reserving 1/2 cup cooking liquid.

2. Meanwhile, heat oil in a large frying pan over medium-low heat. Add onion and cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until softened. Add mushrooms and garlic and cook, stirring occasionally, for further 5 minutes or until mushrooms soften.

3. Add pasta, reserved cooking liquid,spinach, ricotta, half of the parmesan andhalf the parsley. Cook, stirring, for a further2 minutes or until a smooth sauce forms.Top with remaining parsley and parmesan.

STAFF WELLBEING FINANCIAL HEALTH

You may not have experienced it before, but you've probably noticed a hit to your back pocket as a result of the rising cost of living pressures over the last few months. If you feel like your dollar is not going as far as before, you're not imagining it – expensive groceries and higher interest rates are only a few of the things putting pressure on our financial and personal health.

The continual rise in the cost of living can only add more pressure if you're already struggling. The Royal Commission into Victoria's Mental Health System report found that a disproportionate number of people with mental health issues had a low income. As a low income is already a barrier to finding medical or mental health support, long-term financial problems can only exacerbate this cycle.

Some signs that financial stress is affecting your health and relationships include



While these are normal reactions to being under financial stress, they can affect your health if they continue for more than a few weeks. You could be at risk of developing anxiety or depression. There are some things you can do to help.

Assess your financial situation: Look at your income, savings and debt. Make sense of your income and expenses. Put aside money for unplanned expenses or emergencies.
Take care of your health: Eat a balanced diet and be physically active
Don't be afraid to ask for help: Help is available, you can contact the National Debt Helpline.
